

Richard Rothwell, aged 42, is the managing director of Stoneware Capital. Prior to establishing Stoneware Capital, he was a senior fund manager for Northern Trust Corp, a global asset manager with over \$600 billion in assets under management, where he was responsible for the EAFE product and specialized in international growth equities, as well as being a member of the firm's Investment Policy Committee. He was previously a portfolio manager for Deutsche Asset Management Ltd and Hermes Investment Management Limited investing in US, emerging market and pacific basin equities. From 1985 to 1993 he qualified as a chartered accountant and became an audit manager for Arthur Andersen & Co in its London and Singapore offices.

Richard is a director of SHINE, a leading charity which helps in the education of children. He holds a Masters in Natural Sciences (Hons) from St. John's College, Cambridge University, and is qualified with the Institute of Chartered Accountants in England & Wales.
